





#### Scories Behind the Songs...

THE LORD IS MY LIGHT (Psalm 27) 'The Lord is the stronghold of my life, so why should I even be afraid.' When the Psalmist wrote these words, his enemies were trying to destroy him from every side. In 2020 when we were first confronted with the fear of the deadly virus, many of us found refuge in the words of the Psalms. I (Nigel) wanted to encapsulate the essence of Psalm 27 into a song with a strong Celtic melody and was reminded of the Irish folk song Women of Ireland, famously recorded by Kate Bush but more familiar to me from a version by Mike Oldfield. The Psalm lyric 'I will sing and make music to the Lord with shouts of joy' seemed to resonate, especially at a time when churches were closed because of the virus and many of us missed singing together in worship. We are so thankful that we could still sing at home and record our music in the studio, even if that meant following social distancing guidelines. I felt sure that our version of this Psalm would be a powerful declaration of war against fear and maybe even an arrow fired into the very heart of our invisible enemy - Coronavirus itself. This was confirmed when Dave Bainbridge told me he felt drawn to a specific guitar to play his solo for this track – a Corona Stratocaster!

DARKEST DAY (Julie's Dream) It was in 2019, when I (Julie) was on a retreat when I had very vivid dream of walking down a narrow, ancient cobbled street in what looked like the old city in Jerusalem. I remember seeing that the cobbles were semi-transparent, and thinking, 'Oh, I must be in heaven!'. Reaching the bottom of the hill, I was surrounded by happy, eager children, who were all asking me: 'Do you know my mommy? Do you know my daddy? You must know them...you come from the same place.' I realised in the dream that these were children who had never been born on earth, but still had a great attachment to and love for their earthly parents. The scene changed in the dream to a nursery school (I used to do music classes in nursery schools and I was sitting with my guitar, with the children at my feet. One of the children said 'teach us a song we can sing for our mommies (parents)' and I knew they wanted to sing a song of blessing for them. The dream affected me deeply and for a while I couldn't share it without crying... but somehow knew the story could be healing for those who have lost unborn children, whether through natural or deliberate circumstances... that the children still loved their parents deeply, were happy and full of love and forgiveness. So, Nigel sensitively set the story into a song, with a powerful traditional tune he has always loved which holds a note of lament as well as hope. Nigel explained the story to Dave Bainbridge before he added his several instrumental layers, which certainly fulfilled the brief very powerfully. We hope the song can be used to heal many who have gone through this trauma of losing their little ones, and also that it will bring comfort to any who have lost a loved one. DO NOT WORRY This song, together with 'From Generation to Generation' started out as one long guitar instrumental entitled 'Three Boys', by our regular contributor Phil Hart, from Belfast. He composed the music as a prayer for his three teenage sons. Phil had already suggested that some of his instrumentals could do with lyrics but this one had eluded me (Nigel) for some time because, although I wanted to honour the sentiment behind the music, I didn't think I could write a song about Phil's children! Then, something very unusual happened: In July 2020, Julie and I were visiting family in Brussels and, one afternoon, while we were babysitting our grandson William, I took time out to see if I could get inspiration for lyrics, and thought to myself: 'if I was writing something for my own daughter and her family, what would I write?' With headphones on, pressing play on Phil's 'Three Boys' track, I started singing spontaneously with the music and the first thing that came out was 'Sometimes I feel afraid for my family. Sometimes I worry about the safety of our children, but then You remind me of Your promises'. No sooner had I written those lines down when I heard something above the music in my headphones - it was someone shouting, and it was coming from upstairs where Julie was babysitting. As I got up to investigate, I realised it was Julie repeatedly calling William's name in a very alarming way. William had disappeared! We were in a very tall building and we started to wonder what could possibly have happened to our three-year-old grandson, who was clearly no longer in the room. Thankfully the stair-gate was still locked so he couldn't have escaped downstairs, and the windows were shut, so there had to be a logical explanation. Then I noticed a door on the landing that was slightly ajar. This door led upstairs to the loft, but still no sign of William and no response to our calls. There was another door leading into a small loft bedroom and on further investigation, there on the bed, was a lump, underneath the bedclothes. The lump was our grandson William, who was hiding, quiet as a mouse! With some major sighs of relief, and after calming down, I realised how significant this was and I told Julie about the lyrics I had just written. We had been immediately tested and our natural human reaction was to be very afraid indeed. However, the sense of peace that prevailed after this episode reminded us even more how we can put our trust in God, even when nothing around us makes sense.

FROM GENERATION TO GENERATION As I returned to continue writing the lyrics I was drawn to the passage in Luke 1 where Mary was 'greatly troubled' by the news that she was about to become the mother of Jesus, but the angel said to her, "Do not be afraid, you have found favour with God." She then responds with a song, 'The Magnificat', in which she proclaims 'His mercy extends to those who fear him, from generation to generation.' Mary's song and Phil's upbeat music inspired my own song of thankfulness 'When I think of all you've done for me, my heart sings', then as I discovered other verses on the theme of God's goodness to all generations, the song was almost complete. However, it was Julie's lyric 'May all our children and their families, know your blessing' that gave us the idea of asking our children and their spouses to sing the four different parts on the end section of the song. So, Paul & Rachel (Netherlands), Brittney & AJ (USA), Dan & Hannah and Pete & Ellie (England) all agreed to record their voices at home. With our grandchildren still too young to record, the voices of Nigel's great-niece and nephew, Caitlin & Caleb (Northern Ireland) represented their generation. We are so excited to have three generations of our family all singing together as one, on this powerful declaration that 'He is faithful' and 'We will sing a new song to the Lord!'

THE GREAT REUNION When Phil Hart composed this piece of music for acoustic guitar, he was thinking of that great day in the future when we will be reunited with lost loved ones in our eternal home in heaven. There is a lot of healing and hope in this music, so I (Nigel) thought if lyrics were going to be written to it, they would have to reflect that journey and speak about heaven. When I started to look at some passages in Revelation for inspiration. I just couldn't believe what happened, as one by one, the phrases seemed to jump off the pages of my Bible to fit exactly with the melodies that Phil had written. Section by section, the lyrics were flowing seamlessly and the whole song was written in a few hours. When we first recorded our vocals and sent the song to Phil for approval, he wept, and later assured me that this was 'in a good way'. We genuinely believe that the Holy Spirit inspired Phil with the exact melodies that would later be used for these lyrics. We love collaborating with Phil and the Holy Spirit!

**BEAUTIFUL HOME** The same thing happened again when I was looking for a traditional hymn on the theme of heaven that might fit Phil's beautiful melody **Heaven's Shores**. The title 'Beautiful Home' was one of the first ones that caught my eye, but I didn't need to look any further as the lyrics fitted perfectly with the theme and title of our album and were very easily adapted.

IN HEAVENLY LOVE ABIDING Many vears ago I discovered that this traditional hymn was the perfect fit to the beautiful Irish air Raglan Road. also known as The Dawning of the Day. The lyrics offer hope instead of fear, but on singing them afresh I was moved by the lines 'I will walk with Him' and 'He will walk with me' which in turn echo Psalm 23's 'Yea though I walk through death's dark vale'. Thus, the idea was born for a medley of these Irish and Scottish melodies. with Welsh and English lyrics and we hope our Celtic arrangement lights up the truth about our Shepherd who will never leave or forsake us.

ENCIRCLE ME HOLY TRINITY We have produced two albums now by our European group The Worship Company, which has a very similar line-up to Celtish, but features the songs and lead vocals of Wytze Valkema from the Netherlands. We believe in his songs so much that we wanted to re-work this track (with his permission) from the album Emerald. It is a heartfelt prayer for the 'Fountain of Life' to spring up again where layers of dead religion have blocked the ancient wells, especially in these islands from where Celtic Saints once sailed to spread the Gospel far and wide.

THE RESERVE OF THE PARTY OF THE

February 2020 (pre-lockdown) we were having a few days break in County Wicklow, Ireland. As we were having breakfast one morning overlooking the stunning view of where two rivers meet, a friend asked if we had ever sung the song The Meeting of the Waters inspired by the very place where we were staying, Nigel knew there was a song of that title, but it was only when he researched the original folk song to listen to it that he remembered the tune from a setting of the hymn 'My Jesus I Love Thee' he once played at a men's conference in Ireland. Julie loved the melody and, as we read the lyrics of the hymn together, we both got the goosebumps and vowed to record this on a future Celtish album. In July we were reminded of this song again when a friend of Julie's sent an encouraging word for us about 'two rivers meeting and flowing together'. Little did she know when sharing the picture that we had just returned to 'The Meeting of the Waters' for Julie's birthday and were literally standing looking out over the two rivers! After laying down the simple structure for the song, our friend Peter Richards (Epiphany) agreed to score an arrangement for string quartet. However, when the live strings recording had to be cancelled due to COVID19 restrictions, Richard Williamson (viola) successfully facilitated each person recording their own part individually from their homes.

MY JESUS I LOVE THEE Back in

PRAYER OF AIDAN Inspired by our time on 'Holy Island', Lindisfarne (Northumbria) in 2019, on this album we wanted to honour the Celtic Saint, Aidan, whose monastery was established there in the 7th Century. Aidan was a man of great humility and compassion who lived out the Christian message as well as preaching it. He treated and valued everyone, rich or poor, in the same way, welcoming them 'home'. His life and teaching was the inspiration for Prayer of Aidan written by Andy Raine who is based on Lindisfarne and is a founder member of the Northumbria Community. With Julie's beautiful melody and Andy's lyrics (adapted by Nigel), we pray that this song and its instrumental Prelude version (track 1) will carry you 'home' to a place of sanctuary, like Holy Island still does for many pilgrims to this day.

PRAYER OF COLUMBA, which closes the album, is attributed to the 6th century Celtic Saint from Ireland who founded a monastery on the Scottish island of Iona. He speaks of the nearness of God as being the basis of not fearing the future - a very important truth for this time! He was a seer and received beautiful prophetic visions from God, all out of his time being "alone with none but Thee my God". May our season of being 'hidden' at HOME bring similar fruit in our own lives.
